PARQ (Procedure, Alternatives, Risks & Questions) conference

Procedure: LARYNGEAL RADIESSE INJECTION

(elective injection of Calcium Hydroxylapatite into the vocal folds)

Alternatives: Do nothing and leave the voice as is. Other materials may be available for injection to augment the vocal cord. Sometimes voice therapy techniques may be used. Permanent implant options could be placed surgically.

Risks: Allergic reactions, Infection, Complications of Infection, Duration of effect

Allergic reactions

The material may cause an allergic reaction or sensitivity.

Infection

The risk of bacterial infection, though small, is always present with any injection that passes through the skin.

Complications of injection

It is possible to experience a reaction to the process itself, such as bruising at the injection site. Though unlikely, it is possible for the needle to be accidentally placed through a blood vessel during injection, which could result in bruising or to a scab and/or scar formation. As with all substances that are injected, the Radiesse could be accidentally injected into a blood vessel. If you are using drugs that reduce coagulation, you may experience increased bruising or bleeding at injection sites. It is possible for the material to be placed in a less than optimal location.

Duration of effect

Several months would seem to be the normal duration. It is unlikely that the effects of the injection will be permanent.
